Trustees' Annual Report Year ended 31 December 2020

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. Membership of Kirk Session is constituted of the elders and minister.

Elders can be appointed in three ways. These are

1) nomination and direct election by members of the congregation;

2) a system of signed lists, in which members of the congregation submit a signed list of names. The names having the greatest number of votes are elected;

3) nomination and appointment by the Kirk Session

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session has oversight of the whole life and service of the Church within its Parish; responsibility for the spiritual and temporal oversight of the Congregation's affairs. The Kirk Session also delegates certain areas of its work to committees and may also appoint members and non members of the congregation to serve on such committees. Committees operate within the remit granted to them by Kirk Session.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Achievements and Performance

Sunday worship – In our parish of North Knapdale we rotate our Sunday worship between the three communities which serve the wider area of North Knapdale; we meet in Tayvallich 1st and 3rd Sundays, Bellanoch 2nd and 4th Sundays and Achnamara Hall on the 5th Sunday where we have Cafe Church. Due to the global pandemic our church buildings shut on 16 March and have not reopened.

In January we organised a training course for Refugio meditation. At the start of the year there was an Alpha course running and one of our elders was running a pastoral care training course. After lockdown happened we upskilled and then continued Alpha on Zoom. Once the course was completed the guests then joined the housegroup which is also running on Zoom. One of the benefits of Zoom is that we have guest speakers from all over the country and abroad including our previous minister and the Moderator of the General Assembly. The pastoral care course is on hold as not all members had access to Zoom and the format of the training course is very inter-active and empathic.. The session clerk sends out a weekly email with news and a mini sermon.

During Lockdown 1, the Elders have kept in touch with, and supported, members of NK Church by phone on a regular basis. During the ease of lockdown, 3 lunch groups met outside to share a meal and fellowship with each other. The Elders' phone numbers are readily available for people to call.

A weekly Intercessory Prayer Group was started in November 2020 to pray for the needs of anyone who lived within the Parish, whether members of our Church or not. This was promoted through our weekly Newsletter and its website and the prayer group is hosted on the Church's Zoom platform. Three of our elders are Intercessors as is a member from another village. She goes out on regular walks round her village and brings any prayer needs to the group. We continue to pray until the need is met in God's way.

A request from Presbytery was issued towards the end of 2020 for Elders to be trained in Suicide Awareness. Due to an unforeseen delay by the Trainer, this was carried out at the beginning of 2021. One of our Elders completed that training, thus meeting the request

that every Church had an Elder who had done so.

At Christmas, all the elders submitted a short word of comfort or passage of Scripture, which were then made into Cards by our Treasurer and sent out to all our members or delivered by Elders to those living close by.

Members of our congregation are actively involved in a wide variety of community groups and societies. Some of these are now meeting on zoom. Members of the congregation are doing all they can to keep safe (the elderly) and to help their neighbours.

Financial Review

Just under half of income is standing orders (48%). envelopes and open plate 14% and tax reclaimed 24%, donations 7% and interest 6% make up the remainder. The annual income has decreased by 45% over last year as a result of closing the church in March and being unable to hold any fundraising events. Excluding maintenance costs, which are refunded from our investment revenue the expenditure has not changed significantly from last year. this leaves us with a deficit for the year of over £4000.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately nine months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £37767. This represents considerably more than nine months' expenditure, therefore the excess will be considered for transfer to the growth fund.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session / Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of North Knapdale Parish Church of Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020 which are set out on pages 5 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
